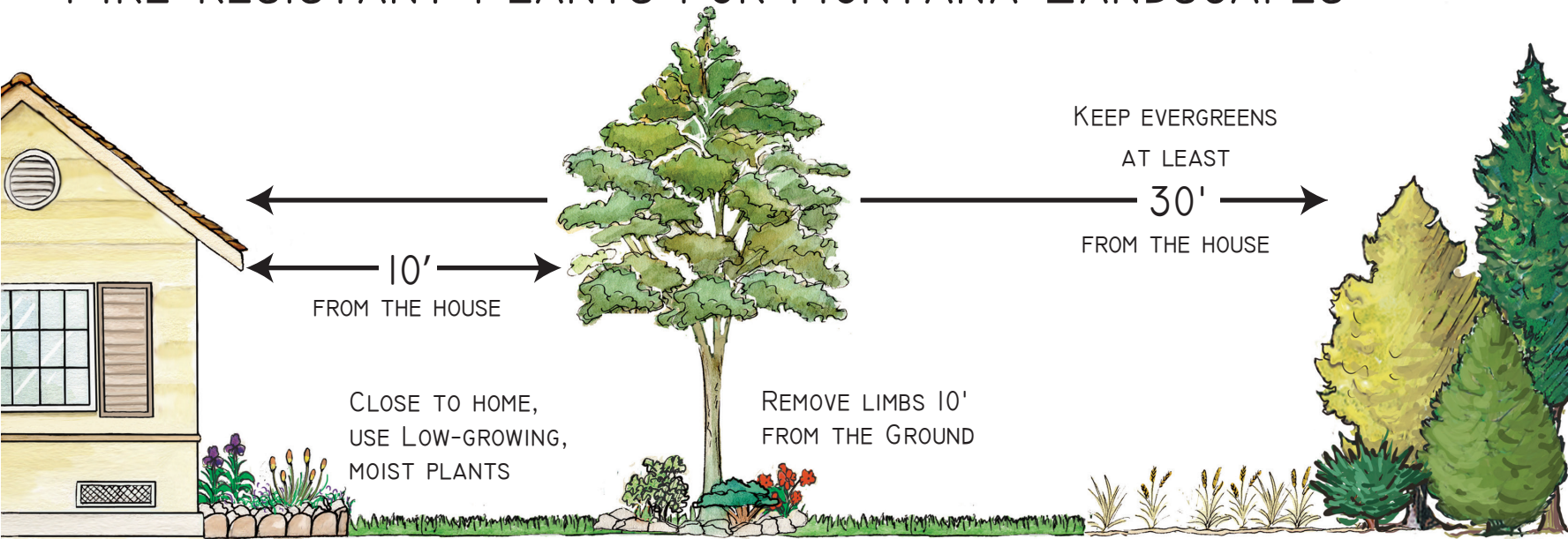


FIRE-RESISTANT PLANTS FOR MONTANA LANDSCAPES

BY GARDENING WITH FIRE-RESISTANT PLANTS AROUND YOUR HOME,
YOU CAN REDUCE THE RISK OF WILDFIRE IGNITION AND SPREAD

STUDIES HAVE FOUND AS MANY AS 80% OF HOMES LOST TO WILDLAND FIRE COULD
HAVE BEEN SAVED BY OWNERS FOLLOWING A FEW SIMPLE FIRE-SAFE PRACTICES

GARDENS NEXT TO YOUR HOME SHOULD INCLUDE PLANTS THAT ARE:

- LOW GROWING - LESS THAN 2 FEET TALL → LESS FUEL AND SHORTER FLAMES
- DECIDUOUS - DROP LEAVES IN AUTUMN → MOST LACK FLAMMABLE CHEMICALS
- LARGE, THICK LEAVES → HIGH MOISTURE CONTENT, TAKE LONGER TO IGNITE
